Regina Airport Authority Requires a Firefighter to be responsible for firefighting, rescue services and emergency medical responses. The role is responsible for rapidly and safely performing duties in hazardous environments and emergency conditions. The primary objective is to save lives in the event of an aircraft accident or incident. A secondary responsibility is to preserve property and evidence. Other duties may include daily checks and light maintenance of equipment, facilities and fire trucks, as well as educating the public on fire prevention and safety.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- While promoting safety and security awareness, perform all duties with an ownership attitude in compliance with corporate policies and procedures.
- Responsible for providing customer service excellence through daily security, operations and facilities systems monitoring and issue resolution, interaction and communication with staff, tenants, passengers, and stakeholders.
- Perform all duties and responsibilities in a manner consistent with the companies Mission, Vision and Corporate Values.
- Respond to emergencies including aircraft, structural, medical, hazardous materials and environmental, which may be life threatening.
- Participate in ongoing internal emergency response training.
- Operate emergency response equipment and perform special techniques in the suppression of fires and to preserve life and property.
- Respond to after-hours calls as required.
- Perform minor preventative daily maintenance on fire hall related vehicles, equipment and buildings related to crash, fire and rescue operations.
- Participate in ongoing theory and the practical firefighter training program in accordance with the Canadian Aviation Regulations (CARs) and appropriate training courses.
- Support the development and implementation of fire safety guidelines and evacuation plans for corporate owned buildings and structures.
- Support and promote fire prevention initiatives.
- Participate in ongoing Firefighter Emergency Response Service vehicle familiarization training.
- Participate cross training initiatives with outside agencies.
- Administer the fire inspection program.
- Track aircraft movement statistics and complete monthly reporting.
- Perform the duties of Firefighter Captain in their absence and as requested.
- Perform off-winter season (April 1 – October 31) airfield inspections program inclusive of generating Aircraft Movement Surface Condition Reports (AMSCR) as required.
- Conduct the Airport Vehicle Operations Permit (AVOP) program apron, taxi and runway tests; facilitate training as required.
- Administer the hot work and red tag permit programs.
- Annually participate and complete fitness testing within prescribed standards.
- Administer Standard Operating Guidelines.
- Administer testing and maintenance of fire suppression systems and alarms; maintain accurate records.
- Assist with annual foam and dry chemical tests required by CARs and file related documents.
- Ensure adherence to all applicable CARs.

REQUIREMENTS

- Current certification of the NFPA 1001 Level 1 and 2.
- Current Medical First Responders I/AED SK certification.
- Minimum of 3 – 5 years' firefighting experience.
- Equivalent combination of education and experience would be considered.
